COVID 19 Highly infectious virus pandemic of 2020/21	Customers, Instructors, Staff, Public	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Social distancing measures have been implemented at Horseshoe Lake Activity Centre in alignment with UK Government and National Governing Bodies relating to the sports offered. • All activities will only be offered as pre-bookable slots through the website. • All shared equipment will be thoroughly cleaned between uses. • All social distancing rules are displayed on the website, signs and given verbally by staff. • The building and inside toilets will remain closed to the public. • Rules will be monitored and updated as Government guidelines change. • Any time a member of staff is required to be closer than 1m to a customer or member of public all parties should wear a face mask unless exempt. • Any customers or public that enter an inside area must wear a face mask unless exempt.
First Aid	Patient, First aider.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When first aid is administered both the first aider and the patient should wear a face mask unless exempt. • First aider to wear gloves. • Hand sanitiser available in all first aid kits.
On the water rescues	Participants Instructors Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Whenever a water user requires assistance the powerboat driver should attempt to coach the participant to self rescue. • If the participant cannot self rescue then the member of staff/instructor can assist, with as little contact as possible, and should wear a mask where practicable. (Face Masks should not be worn in the water) • If an instructor needs to make an adjustment to a sailing dinghy, the participant should face away from the instructor at the opposite end of the boat. • Hand sanitiser available around site and in the powerboats. • If a customer needs to be transported in a powerboat, they should sit at the front of the boat as far from the driver as is sensible, facing forward, wearing a face mask where practicable.
